

Notes from the Cedar Valley Chapter

On April 26, about 24 members of the Cedar Valley chapter met at Olive Garden for a nice meal and a talk by two young controllers from KCID tower, with the meeting arrangements by Jim and Nancy Green. They spoke about the upcoming major construction project at CID to replace 9-27. Taxiway Alpha will be lighted and painted to replace the east-west runway, and will be designated 8-26 to eliminate confusion. It will have a displaced threshold on the east end, and please don't cheat on this: there are lights on cables in that area. The temporary runway is 7600 x 125 feet. It will weight restricted, so the big guys will have to use 13-31, except for when that runway is not useable because of work on the main intersection. The whole project will take 112 days and start June 3, when charts change. Keep up with the notams - there will be lots of back taxiing, and they might get stacked up and send us elsewhere for practice approaches and touch and goes. See the diagram for an overview.



The May meeting of the Cedar Valley chapter, arranged by Dave Pearson, will be a tour and meal at Alpha Omega Aircrafters.
